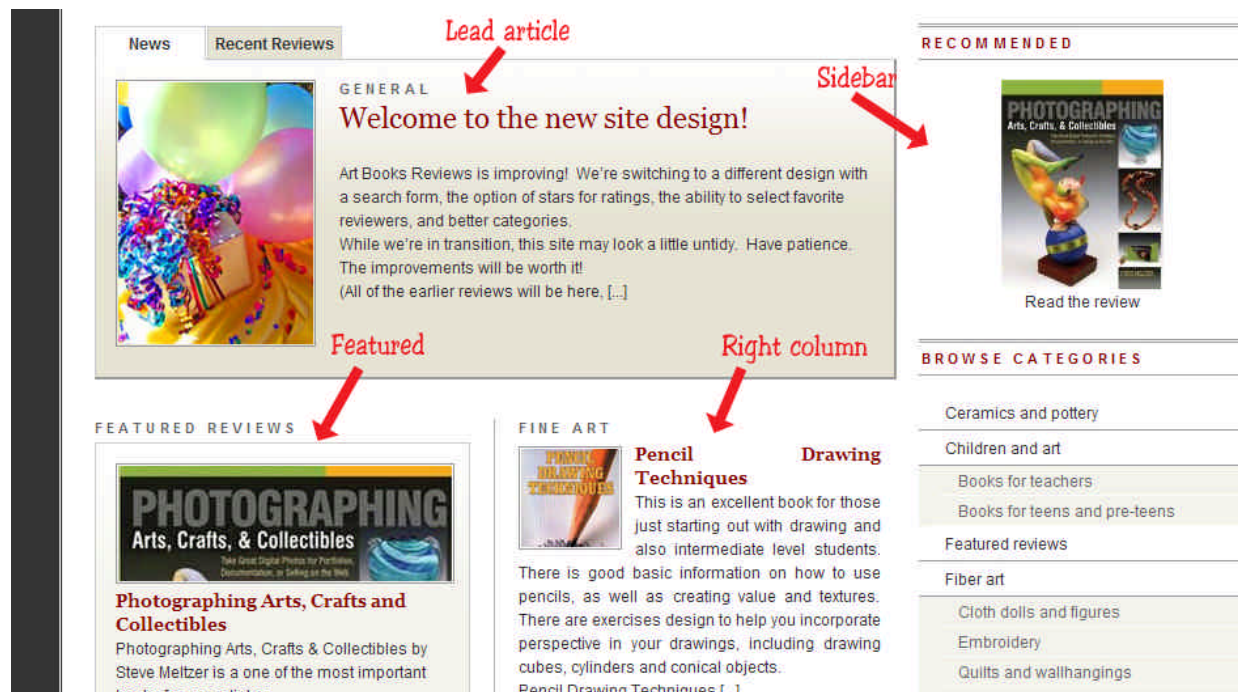


Adding images to your homepage

First, let's review some of the terms. You'll see three columns on the homepage of the website. (Once again, I'm using the ArtBooksReviews.com website as the example. Your website may look different and display different category names.)

The far right column is the Sidebar. The middle column is actually called the *Right* column. The far left column is for Featured articles... regardless of what you call that category at your website.

The big article at the top of the page is called the Lead article. Generally, I save that for news about the website, so visitors learn about new features, freebies and categories, and know where to browse. But, your website may use it for something else. It's still the Lead article.



Let's talk about that middle column, technically called the Right column. It automatically includes blurbs from the most recent posts in selected Categories.

As you can see, each article blurb is accompanied by a small, icon-sized image. Those images don't appear in the actual article, only on the homepage.

You'll need to add those images manually, using something called Custom Fields.

First, you'll create the image. For that right column to look its best, the image must be 75 pixels by 75 pixels, at the standard 72 pixels/inch.
